Dear Families:

Summer comes and goes quickly and all of us want to make the most of the season. This directory will help you find activities that children and families can enjoy. Summer is a wonderful time for students to participate in a program that can provide new experiences and reinforce skills learned during the school year to support year-round learning. This helps to prevent summer learning loss and keeps kids engaged in positive ways.

Finding an affordable summer program that meets your needs can be a challenge. The directory lists a variety of camp, tutorial and other summer programs that are available throughout Hartford and the surrounding area, as well as park and pool schedules, free lunch programs and other activities. Youth programs offer a combination of activities to promote learning and youth development, and an opportunity for parents to participate. Options for both youth and adults with disabilities, as well as for senior citizens, are included.

Look through the directory and use the information to decide which programs are best for your children, teens, elderly or other family members, including free job training opportunities and cultural programs. If there is a charge for the program, it is noted; however, a number of programs are offered free, or at reduced fees based on income. We recommend registering as early as possible and asking program staff whether financial aid is available.

What should I know before I get started?

Begin by exploring with your children their interests in activities offered in the summer program listings. Also, be sure to talk with their teachers about their academic needs and whether your child may be required to attend summer school. You will need to be sure that the programs you choose won't conflict with summer school dates and times, and to identify times during the summer your children will be able to participate in additional summer programs.

If your child is required to attend summer school, find out in which school the sessions will take place, and check the program listings (or ask school staff) for summer programs operating in or near the school that your child will be attending, so that they can participate in programs after summer school ends each day.

A number of the day programs are located in Hartford area schools. Be sure to check with staff to confirm locations and schedules.

Can my child attend both the Hartford Public Schools Early Start or other HPS programs, and a summer camp or other community program?

Yes. The Hartford Public Schools Early Start or other program sessions are held either in the morning or afternoon and a number of the summer camps and other community programs offer half-day sessions. So, if your child is attending Early Start or other HPS programs, he or she can attend a camp or other community program either for a half day or participate in a full-day program during June or early July before summer school is in session. Many of the Hartford school-based

programs are designed to provide enrichment activities around the summer school sessions. A few programs also continue after summer school ends in August.

Youth not participating in HPS summer programs may enroll in a full-day summer program. For details on the Hartford Public Schools Early Start and other programs, please refer to the summary in this directory. For additional details, visit the HPS website: www.hartfordschools.org/summer2016.

What's in each summer program listing?

1. **Program location**
2. **Activities offered**
3. **Area and ages served**
4. **Start and end-dates and length of each session**

Note: A summer program may be open for six weeks or more, but campers normally attend for one- or two-week sessions, not all six weeks. Some programs allow participants to attend multiple sessions. Other programs may restrict the number of sessions each participant may attend. Several of the CIT and tutorial programs require youth to participate for a longer period so they can get

the full benefit of the program. Contact the program that interests you for more information.

5. **Fees and financial aid:** Some programs have fees. If you are unable to pay the program fee, please contact the program anyway. Many programs offer "camperships," which are similar to scholarships. Your child may qualify for a campership or reduced fee based on family income. Be sure to contact the program that interests you as soon as possible to find out, and note the "◆" and "₩" symbols used in this directory to indicate when programs offer free or reduced fees to qualified applicants.

- 6. **Transportation:** Some programs provide transportation. This is noted in the listing.
- 7. **Registration deadline/program contacts:** The registration deadline and program staff contact information are listed, but don't wait until the deadline to call. Call as

soon as possible to help ensure that your child and other family members can participate in the program of their choice. If the registration deadline has passed, call the program to see if space is available.

How to use this directory

This directory lists 49 summer programs that support building skills and youth development. It is divided into three sections: camp, counselor-in-training and tutorial programs.

■ Camp Programs

These summer programs offer a variety of fun learning activities including sports, arts, crafts, theater, swimming, computers, science, reading and other enrichment activities, and much, much more. Both residential and day programs are offered. Pick a program that best suits your child's interests.

■ Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Programs

These programs offer older youth who are too young to

work a regular job the chance to earn a little money and receive training as assistants at camps or other summer programs. Many of the programs offer a small stipend while helping teens gain important leadership skills. You'll want to sign up quickly for these programs as CIT internships go fast!

■ Tutorial Programs

These programs encourage your child's love of learning and academic success – with an emphasis on fun. Each program is different. Review the program descriptions, talk with program staff and select the program that will best meet your child's academic needs and interests.

How do I enroll my child in one of these programs?

Contact the program directly as soon as possible. Use the contact information listed in the program listings. If one

program is full, call another. There are many options available for children and youth living in the Greater Hartford area.

Are there other summer programs available for children and youth in Greater Hartford?

Yes. For information about summer programs not listed in this directory, dial 2-1-1. Also be sure to review the Hartford Department of Families, Children, Youth & Recreation programs on page 13. The Agency Phone Index on page 32 can also be helpful in finding additional programs.

2-1-1 can help families find other services, including free summer food programs for kids, food cooperatives and food pantries, housing information, benefits assistance, health care options, child care programs, services for children with

Early Start and Afternoon Enrichment Program

(Grades K-7): Monday, July 11 – Friday, August 5, 2016

The Hartford Public Schools offers the Early Start summer school program for students in grades K-7 who are state and district mandated to participate based on the need for academic support. Early Start students will receive instructional intervention in the school they attended during the 2015-2016 school year. Academic instruction, breakfast, lunch, nursing services and transportation (for eligible students) are provided at no cost for mandated students.

Please check with your school site for additional information and updates regarding the Early Start Summer Program.

The purpose of the Early Start summer school program is to prevent summer learning loss and to improve academic performance of reading and math skills as evidenced by district and school progress monitoring assessments. In addition, students participate in enrichment learning opportunities provided by Community-Based Organizations (CBOs).

The Hartford Department of Families, Children, Youth and Recreation offers a multitude of safe and quality programs that will focus on physical fitness, health awareness, sports, arts and crafts, cultural activities, and nutrition for residents of all ages and abilities for the summer.

Our American Red Cross certified lifeguards are located at our four outdoor pools, which offer swim lessons for children and adults, city-wide swim-team and recreational supervised swim for children, adults and families. Some park playgrounds will be supervised and have amenities that may include spray pools, basketball courts and league play, pony rides, tennis lessons, field trips, and free concerts and performances.

There are several City of Hartford schools, playgrounds, agencies and organizations that will be offering free breakfasts and lunches to Hartford youngsters ages 18 and under, from Monday, June 27–Friday, August 5. Most programs are open and free to Hartford residents. Some programs have limited enrollment and will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Starting this Summer of 2016, in order to access City Pools, Recreation/Community Centers and City grant funded Summer/Afterschool Programs, Hartford youth 8–15 years old must show a Hartford Public Library Card. Those 16 years of age and older must present a valid Connecticut Motor Vehicle Operator's License or Connecticut non-drivers photo ID card which indicates their Hartford address.
