Adult literacy programs offer instruction to adults who want to improve their reading and writing skills. Programs are held in varied settings such as libraries, schools, family resource centers, YMCAs and other community centers. Some organizations such as Literacy Volunteers also offer instruction in ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages), GED test preparation, mathematics and other educational subjects. Standardized tests are often used to help determine the literacy levels of students and to track their individual progress in their classes.
