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When May a Landlord Increase Your Rent?

A landlord has the right to raise your rent. However, the rent cannot be increased during the term of a written lease unless both you and your landlord have specifically agreed to permit him/her to do that. Without a written lease you would have an oral lease, and since this kind of lease is considered a month-to-month lease, your landlord has the right to increase your rent at any time.
